Regular Meeting

October 9, 2017

Mayor Laggis opened the monthly meeting at 6:59. In attendance were Mayor Laggis as well as Councilman Wright, Councilman Gilson and Councilman Carden. The minutes from September's meeting were approved, with Councilman Carden making the motion and being seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed.

Financial Report

In the building account there was interest of \$2.77 for August and \$25.22 for September. There were no expenses. The ending balance was \$242,431.76. In the operating account incoming was the following: Alcohol Tax - \$827.75, Sale of Office Chairs - \$41.00, and Interest for August of \$1.07 and Interest for September of \$1.00. Expenses were the following: Clerk - \$300.00, Lawn Care - \$300.00, Rent - \$50.00, and ATT - \$60.29. The ending balance was \$62,776.85. Councilman Gilson made the motion to approve the financial report and was seconded by Councilman Carden. Motion passed.

Old Business

- 1. Building Update Mr. Smith reported that we are still awaiting the plans from Jim Finney, the architect. He will follow up with him if the plans have not been received by the 13th. Councilman Gilson asked about Bob Barnard's schedule and was told that it should take 8 months from the start date. Mayor Laggis said that he had not heard anything from Mr. Barnard to indicate that there would be any delay in starting, once the permits are issued. He has even had conversations with his subcontractors.
- 2. Other Mayor Laggis reported that the transportation committee had met and was told that there was some leftover money from the previous SPLOST. They were tasked to prioritize projects from the master plan. Two of these had direct implications on Woolsey. They were reconfiguring Hampton Road, which was crossed off the list, and improvements to Highway 92 from McBride to the Spalding County line. Councilman Wright mentioned that it might not be a bad idea to start thinking about a Historic Preservation designation.

New Business

- 1. Emergency Services Breakfast Saturday, December 2nd at 9:00am.
- 2. Other Councilman Gilson told Council that Jamie Lovett had some things that she may want to donate to the museum once it is completed.

With no more business to come before the council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:57pm.
