# **Regular Meeting**

**September 10, 2018** 

Mayor Laggis opened the first monthly meeting in our new location at 7:00. In attendance were Mayor Laggis, as well as Councilman Wright, Councilman Gilson and Councilman Carden. The minutes from August's meeting were approved with Councilman Carden making the motion for approval and he was seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed. Councilman Carden made a motion to begin each meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and he was seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed.

# Financial Report

In the building account there was the following: Interest -- \$3.78. Expenses were Water – \$18.48, Jack Gilson - \$61.08, Gary Laggis - \$2908.43 and Check Printing Charges - \$19.85. The ending balance was \$11,395.64. In the operating account income was the following: Alcohol Tax – \$293.26, and Interest - \$1.25. Expenses were the following: Clerk - \$300.00, Lawn Care - \$300.00, Rent - \$50.00, STI - \$1053.66, STI - \$1651.28 and ATT - \$207.42. The ending balance was \$70,333.73. Councilman Wright made the motion to approve the financial report and was seconded by Councilman Carden. Motion Passed.

#### Old Business

1. Building Update – Mayor Laggis recommended that the town keeps paying "rent" to the building account to cover upkeep and maintenance expenses. Councilman Gilson asked if this idea should be run by the Accountant and Mayor Laggis agreed that it would be a good idea. Councilman Carden brought up pest control and all Councilmen were tasked to check with their pest control companies for quotes for bait stations, annual inspections and quarterly monitoring. Must have repair or replacement guarantee. An alarm system is also being looks into. Mr. Smith said that Bob Barnard had asked if the Mayor had asked the County for supplemental SPLOST funds to cover the overage. Mayor Laggis said that he had not as of yet.

Other – Marilyn Taylor, the president of the Retired Teacher's Association, presented Mayor Laggis with a certificate for writing letters to the students that their organization was honoring.

## New Business

- 1. Ribbon Cutting and Open House -The ribbon cutting will be November 1<sup>st</sup> and the open house on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Mayor Laggis told the council that his daughter volunteered to do the invitations.
- 2. Public Safety Breakfast Saturday, December 1<sup>st</sup> at 9:00. A decision will need to be made if it will be held at the building or at the fire station.
- 3. Other The usage of the building will be discussed at the next meeting (cleaning, alcohol allowed...).

With no more business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned.
