

TOWN of WOOLSEY

Regular Meeting

October 14, 2019

Mayor Laggis opened the monthly meeting at 7:03. In attendance were Mayor Laggis as well as Councilmen Frank Carden, and Kenny Wright. Councilman Jack Gilson was absent. The minutes from September's meeting were approved with Councilman Wright making the motion and Councilman Carden seconding it. Motion passed.

Financial Report

See attached. Councilman Carden made a motion to approve the financial report as given and he was seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed.

Old Business

1. Transportation Update – Trees are being cleared on Antioch Rd near Jackson Estates to allow for better sight lines. The 92/Hampton Rd intersection plan was presented to the Transportation Committee. Chairman Ognio noted that, on the plans, Hill Ave was blocked from turning left onto 92. There was also concern that traffic in the turn lane could back up the roundabout, but the Consultant said that should not happen. Also, in order to go north on 92, drivers from Hampton will have to turn right onto 92 and go around the roundabout.
2. Zoning Administrator – Out of the 5 names given to us from Richard Osborn, Bill Johnston only knew one, a group called Pond. Mayor Laggis spoke to Lauren Blazek (who grew up in Fayette County) from Pond. She said that they would definitely be able to help with the Zoning, but was iffy on code enforcement. Mayor Laggis and Councilman Carden will check with 2 or 3 more. Councilman Wright commented that he would prefer them to do both zoning and code enforcement.
3. Community Bulletin Board – Councilman Carden made a motion to approve approximately \$501 to purchase the bulletin board and he was seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed. Purchase has been put on hold until debit card is received.

New Business

1. Retired Teacher's Proclamation – Councilman Carden made the motion to approve the declaration and he was seconded by Councilman Wright. Motion passed.
2. Public Safety Breakfast – December 7th at 9:00am.
3. 9 Month budget Update – All looks well, still haven't received insurance premium tax check.
4. Other – Sheriff's Mobile Headquarters want to be in Woolsey in November. Public is encouraged to attend roll call. Contact Major Eubanks. Councilman Carden asked Mayor Laggis to speak with Phil Mallon about the conditions of the sidewalks north of his shop, the sight lines from Old Farm Rd and sight lines from some driveways. Specifically would like to know who is responsible for maintaining the right of ways.

With no more business to come before the council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:48.
