Mayor Laggis opened the meeting at 7:00.

Minutes of Meeting

Councilman Carden made a motion to approve the minutes from the October meeting as written. Councilman Wright seconded him. Councilman Smith concurred and the motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report

Councilman Smith noted that we received a large deposit from the Insurance Commission Premium Tax. Clerk was asked to follow up with the Insurance Commissioner's Office for a summary of allocation. Councilman Smith made a motion to approve the Financial Report as submitted. Councilman Wright seconded him and Councilman Carden concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Transportation Update – Caitlin Storc reported that AGL came out to do surface lining and their next step is to hydro-excavate. She also attended a virtual summit with GA Bike/Walk in regards to the mixed-use pathway that is being discussed for Lake Horton/Woolsey area. Caitlin asked Council if they would be interested in different signage for Hampton Rd, such as a watch out for pedestrians and/or weight limit for vehicles on Hampton Rd. Councilman Wright asked if the Sheriff's Office would enforce and Councilman Smith replied that would be up to the Dept of Public Safety to monitor this issue. They have the ability to issue tickets. Councilman Carden commented that anything that can be done to help the situation would be better than nothing. Finally Caitlin mentioned that there will be a public hearing this week in regards to the HWY 279 realignment.

2. Other – Annual Public Safety Breakfast will be Saturday, December 3rd.

New Business

1. Exterior Painting of Town Hall – Mayor Laggis informed Council that the building had been pressure washed due to it starting to mildew. Paint is starting to peel away on the north and west sides of the building but not terribly. The Mayor and Councilman Wright both agreed to get estimates and Councilman Smith will check with the paint store by his office to see which paint would be the best.

With no more business to come in front of the Council, Councilman Wright made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:27 p.m. He was seconded by Councilman Carden. Motion passed unanimously.
