Regular Meeting

December 9, 2024

Mayor Laggis opened the meeting at 7:00 pm. There was no power in the building so the meeting was held in the dark.

Agenda Changes

Minutes of Prior Meeting

Councilman Carden made a motion to accept the November minutes as presented. He was seconded by Councilman Wright and Councilman Smith concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report

Councilman Smith made the motion to carry over the approval of the Financial Report until the January meeting to allow for additional transactions to be accounted for in 2024. Councilman Carden seconded him and Councilman Wright concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Transportation Committee Update – No update as out representative was not in attendance.
2. Public Safety Breakfast – Councilman Wright reported that 18 members of the FCFD enjoyed the breakfast as did 31 Sheriff's officers, which included 17 that were on duty at the jail. The leftovers were left at the fire station.
3. Other – Councilman Smith has not heard back from Mr. Ballard. He will reach back out to him. Councilman Wright plans on having the newsletter ready to be sent out in mid to late January.

New Business

1. 11 Month Financial Review – the numbers will change with the additional transactions. Mayor Laggis asked the Clerk to itemize the "other expenses" column.
2. Other – Mayor Laggis told the Council that the Mayors and City Managers in Fayette County have been meeting to discuss HB581, which affects property taxes. Each municipality has the option to "opt out" but must hold three public hearings to do so. Since Woolsey does not have a millage rate at this time, we are only impacted by what the county's millage is set at. To make up for some lost revenue, a FLOST or a T-SPLOST could be on an upcoming ballot, but only if all municipalities "opt in". Councilman Carden commented that it was hard to find good information about HB581 prior to the vote.

With no more business to come before the Council, Councilman Wright made the motion to adjourn. He was seconded by Councilman Carden and Councilman Smith concurred. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
